Larksfoot Stitch Ideas



Hello there! Today I'm on a mission to inspire you, because we truly should make the most of our time during lockdown. Don't let yourself to become a couch potato, unless you have a crochet hook in your hand!



Lark's foot is a very popular (and very simple) knot, and you can see it immediately in this pattern. Once you get it, you can go on with your eyes closed.

Ready? Grab your favorite yarns and crochet hook!





GOOD vibes are here

Although it may not look like it, this stitch is actually quite easy, as it uses <u>basic stitches</u>. The only trick here is working one of the <u>double crochet stitches</u> much lower than the other. This way you can create this characteristic "spike". It's perfect for baby blankets.

Materials

Author of this tutorial used Lion Brand Color Made Easy Yarn, which is 100% acrylic, in three fantastic colors – Huckleberry, Turmeric and Alabaster.

PSST! If you want to know more about yarn ball types, <u>check out my article!</u> She chose 6.5 mm <u>crochet hook</u> for this yarn, but you can use any yarn and corresponding hook size.





We start with <u>slip knot</u> and <u>foundation chain</u> of multiplies of 4 + 1. Next you proceed with <u>double crochet stitches</u> and <u>chain stitches</u> to make a "gap". To create cool larksfoot pattern, you need to work one of your double crochet strategically two rows below. It's not hard to do, but requires some practice in keeping the right tension, so you take a look at my article on <u>how the work with free petitode</u> m/slip-knot/



Delicate lines of pastel rainbow always make me smile, because it's one of the loveliest palettes ever! Amanda's blanket features larksfoot stitch in soft cotton yarn, but it would look great in wool as well. One of the most important things is to learn how to choose colors, and it seems like Amanda did her homework. Take a look below, because it's simply stunning!

Larksfoot Stitch Blanket by Poppyseed and Pom

Stategically placed stripes of color can turn a simple blanket into a stunning piece of art! Caroline from Poppyseed and Pom went for bands of colors alternating with wide white stripes, and it looks amazing! The choice of colors for the panels is spot on, because warm tones of yellow and orange are broken up by lilacs and blue.

Weeping Rainbows Blanket Version by YarnBae

Isn't this sherbet blanket the sweetest? Combination of white, yellows, peach and pinks is light and reminds me of summer. The overall effect is even sweeter thanks to very simple, but cleverly made edging. You can see more of this project <u>here</u>.

Elegant and Feminine Colorways

Double Strand Larksfoot Stitch Blanket by Hooked Yarn Crochet

I'm a big fan of marled and washed out effects on yarn, so I was naturally drawn to this blanket. It uses two strands of yarn, one of which is always cream. If you want to "lighten up" the colors, or make them less vivid, it's definitely a way to go. As you can see in the photo, stripes are still colorful, but the whole blanket has this cute vintage feel.

Do you like lilacs? Me too! This beautiful color palette is a bit subdued, calm, but very refined. Baby blanket like this will look amazing in any interior, introducing very delicate style. It fits both boys and girls, so go for it if you're stuck with your baby shower gift ideas!

Larksfoot Stitch Blanket by Toyah Radbourne

If you are looking for something more mysterious, try using lilacs, blues and mint together. This color combo creates a petrol-like visual effect, which will be perfect for mermaid-loving girls or adult that's into crystals and magic.

Tales of Blue and Green

Blue Larksfoot Stitch Blanket by Kasia Nowak

Delicate tones like these will suit both boys and girls, so it's a great choice if you don't know the baby's sex yet. Kasia's blanket features quite simple combination of colors, but its strength lays in the dusty mint woven into blue and white. As you can see, it makes this

color palette much more sophisticated and refined.







All about the contrasts

Contrasting Larksfoot Stitch Blanket by Cherry

Now this is interesting, don't you think? Cherry's blanket is all about the contrasts, and it's done really well. Take a look at the picture, because there you'll see that dark navy works like a background to red, grey and white. Why is that? Simple! Lighter colors pop when in contact with darks, so that you don't even read navy as larksfoot. Clever, huh?

Larksfoot Stitch Blanket by Kamali Crochet

Mixing and matching dark tones and vivid ones results in nicely visible larksfoot stripes. That's the magic of color! When you put bright yellow next to dark navy, it pops out, turning the dark tones into the background. 



Larking Around Blanket by Sew Hooky

Now that's a real treat to all larksfoot stitch lovers! Crocheter behind Sew Hooky came up with original idea of working this lovely stitch in the round, and it came out great! In the photos you can see that it's not really a circle, because this techniques requires some straight lines. Just work these rounds and make it as big as you like!

Jagged Waves Blanket by Eleri Schofield

Now this one is a real treat, so... larksfoot <u>chevron</u>, anyone? Eleri came up with a brilliant idea to make the spikes go up and down in zig-zags, and it looks amazing! Just take a look at the photos below to see how clever and easy it is, but be sure to choose the right

colorway before you start. This stitch variation is a great alternative to classic <u>granny</u> <u>ripple!</u>
